
CITY ADMINISTRATION

2014 State of the City Address

John Marsh Stone House Heritage Day

Mark your calendar - A Stone House Heritage Day at Marsh Creek State Park has been planned for Saturday, October 11th, 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. This event will be held alongside the historic Stone House in the park next to the Marsh Creek Reservoir at 21999 Marsh Creek Road. Marsh Creek State Park is the largest historic park in the California State Park system and the John Marsh Stone House will be the centerpiece of the park's remarkable 11-acre Historic Zone. Presentations, performances and hands-on activities for kids will highlight five historical aspects of the site: John Marsh and his Stone House; Ancient archeology; the California period; Native Americans and the Westward Movement. Hear the story of John Marsh, view important archeological finds dating 7,000 to 3,000 years old and enjoy the dancing of Bay Miwok tribe, who were native to the Brentwood area and many more activities.

Prescription Drug Drop Off Event

On September 27th from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. the Brentwood Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its ninth opportunity in four years to prevent pill abuse and theft and ridding their homes of potentially dangerous, expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs. Leaf Bags

As part of City efforts to reduce impacts to local landfills, the City will be providing free leaf bags during the fall months. These special bags should only be filled with leaves, and placed curbside on your regular green-waste pickup day. Neighborhood Clean-up Events

Residents of Brentwood who have an active garbage account are invited to participate in the Annual Neighborhood Clean-up Events. Residents can bring unwanted household items to the Brentwood Transfer Station. Accepted items include: yard waste, appliances, e-waste (TVs, computers, etc.), furniture and garbage. The clean-ups will be held Saturdays during September and October. Drop-off days and times are determined by address. 
Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event
