Drought Emergency – Rebates, Incentives and Penalties

At the City Council meeting of May 26, 2015, City Council took several significant actions related to the drought and water conservation, including declaring a drought emergency and implementing rebates, incentives and penalties.

Required Potable Water Use Reductions - Two Ways to Comply

There are **two ways** for residential and non-residential customers to comply with the required monthly potable water use reductions:

- 1) **Percentage**
Residential and Non-Residential Customers – reduce monthly potable water usage by 35% from their 2013 usage (compared by month); **OR**
- 2) **Citywide Averages** - stay within the following Citywide averages for monthly potable water use:
Residential - 11,000 gal. or less (May - Oct.); and 5,000 gal. or less (Nov. - Apr.).
Non-Residential - 32,000 gal. or less (May - Oct.); and 24,000 gal. or less (Nov. - Apr.).

Irrigation Only Potable Water Customers – must reduce monthly use by 40% from their 2013 usage (compared by month). Citywide average is **not** applicable to irrigation only customers.

Rebates

Beginning in July, customers that reduce their monthly potable water use by more than the percentages above are eligible to receive the following rebates as a credit on their utility bill.

<u>Residential and Non-Residential*</u>	<u>Irrigation Only*</u>	<u>Rebate</u>
36% - 40%	41% - 50%	\$10
41% - 50%	51% - 60%	\$25
> 50%	> 60%	\$50

Incentives

The City is developing an incentive program for lawn replacement as well as other incentives. Look for more information in the coming months.

Penalties

Beginning in July, customers that do not reduce their monthly potable water use by the percentages above will be subject to the following penalties.

<u>Residential & Non-Residential*</u>	<u>Irrigation Only**</u>	<u>Penalty</u>
21% - 34%	21% - 39%	\$100
0% - 20%	0% - 20%	\$200
Increased Water Use	Increased Water Use	\$300

Based on 2013 usage. Penalties will **not apply to residential and non-residential customers that stay within the Citywide averages above.*

***Based on 2013 usage. Citywide average **not** applicable to irrigation only customers.*

2015 Pavement Management Program (Slurry Seal) and Trail Pavement Management

The City awarded Telfer Highway Technologies (“Contractor”) the contract to perform this year’s Pavement Management Program (Slurry Seal) and Trail Pavement Management project. This project helps preserve and extend the life of existing roads, parking lots and trails.

This week, the Contractor resurfaced Veteran’s Park parking lot (see photo below) and five different trail segments.

Starting Monday, June 8th, the Contractor will begin resurfacing several streets throughout the city as shown on the attached Streets Map. A notice will be placed in the Brentwood Press showing the specific dates each street will be resurfaced for the upcoming week, and the City’s website has a [revised schedule](#) available for reference. Affected property owners will also receive notices with specifics about when the work will occur and what to expect the day of construction.

The Contractor will be closing the street the day of the slurry seal. The City understands the inconvenience this may cause and appreciates the public’s assistance in not parking on the street and not driving on the resurfaced road until it has had time to set properly. Emergency vehicles will be allowed access at all times. The Contractor will also coordinate with trash and mail services to maintain regular service. Planning Commission

At the June 2nd Planning Commission meeting, the Commission acted on the following item:

- Approved a design review (DR 15-001) application and conditional use permit (CUP 15-003) for Celebration Center preschool, after-school care, and senior daycare, located at 2250 Jeffery Way. The new building will have 9,858 square feet, including room for future expansion. Celebration Center is currently located at 624 Walnut Boulevard and will relocate to the new site by the end of this year.

“Abstract” Marsh Creek Trail Mural Unveiled




Starry Nights Concert Series






2015 PAVEMENT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM VICINITY MAP - SLURRY SEAL PARKING LOTS AND TRAILS
