

## PRELIMINARY APPLICATION FOR HOUSING DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

**Planning Division** 

Revised: August 25, 2021

Per the requirements of SB 330, Skinner – Housing Crisis Act of 2019, an applicant for a housing development project (as defined in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Government Code Section 65589.5) that is consistent with the underlying General Plan designation shall be deemed to have submitted a preliminary application upon providing all of the following information about the proposed project to the City of Brentwood.

Please be aware that planning applications will be automatically withdrawn if an applicant receives an incomplete letter and does not resubmit a substantive response within 120 calendar days. The Zoning Administrator may grant a written extension for up to an additional 90 calendar days when the applicant shows good cause for an extension. Delays due to circumstances outside the applicant's reasonable control will be considered good cause to grant the extension.

4) The proposed land uses by number of units and square feet of residential and nonresidential development using the categories in the applicable zoning ordinance.			
5) The proposed number of parking spaces.			
6) Any proposed point sources of air or water pollutants.			
7) Any species of special concern known to occur on the property.			
8)	Whether	r a portion of the property is located within any of the following:	
	0	A very high fire hazard severity zone, as determined by the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection pursuant to Section 51178.	
	0	Wetlands, as defined in the United States Fish and Wildlife Service Manual, Part 660 FW 2 (June 21, 1993).	
	0	A hazardous waste site that is listed pursuant to Section 65962.5 or a hazardous waste site designated by the Department of Toxic Substances Control pursuant to Section 25356 of the Health and Safety Code.	
	0	A special flood hazard area subject to inundation by the 1 percent annual chance flood (100-year flood) as determined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in any official maps published by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.	



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A delineated earthquake fault zone as determined by the State Geologist in any official maps published by the State Geologist, unless the development complies with applicable seismic protection building code standards adopted by the California Building Standards Commission under the California Building Standards Law (Part 2.5 (commencing with Section 18901) of Division 13 of the Health and Safety Code), and by any local building department under Chapter 12.2 (commencing with Section 8875) of Division 1 of Title 2.				
A stream or other resource that may be subject to a streambed alteration agreement pursuant to Chapter 6 (commencing with Section 1600) of Division 2 of the Fish and Game Code.				
9) Any historic or cultural resources known to exist on the property.				
10) The number of proposed below market rate units and their affordability levels.				
11) The number of bonus units and any incentives, concessions, waivers, or parking reductions requested pursuant to Section 65915.				
12) Whether any approvals under the Subdivision Map Act, including, but not limited to, a parcel map, a tentative map, or a condominium map, are being requested.				
13) The applicant's contact information and, if the applicant does not own the property, consent from the property owner to submit the application (Signature form on the following page).				
14) For a housing development project proposed to be located within the coastal zone, whether any portion of the property contains any of the following:				
<ul> <li>Wetlands, as defined in subdivision (b) of Section 13577 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.</li> </ul>				
<ul> <li>Environmentally sensitive habitat areas, as defined in Section 30240 of the Public Resources Code.</li> </ul>				
o A tsunami run-up zone.				
Use of the site for public access to or along the coast.				
15) The number of existing residential units on the project site that will be demolished and whether each existing unit is occupied or unoccupied.				



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- 16) A site map showing a stream or other resource that may be subject to a streambed alteration agreement pursuant to Chapter 6 (commencing with Section 1600) of Division 2 of the Fish and Game Code and an aerial site photograph showing existing site conditions of environmental site features that would be subject to regulations by a public agency, including creeks and wetlands.
- 17) The location of any recorded public easement, such as easements for storm drains, water lines, and other public rights of way.
