WE MISSED YOU! We're so excited to announce the return of Bingo at the Brentwood Senior Activity Center. While we would like everything to be just as it was, we have to operate under the mandates of the CDC/Contra Costa Health Department/City of Brentwood requirements qand regulations. Try to remember that these regulations are for the safety of all our participants, staff and volunteers.

We are planning for Bingo to resume Monday, February 7th, with doors opening at 1:00pm and games beginning at 1:30pm.

Due to current restrictions, everyone will need to pre-register at the Senior Center lobby front desk. Registration will begin Monday, January 31 through February 3, from 8:30am–4:00pm, in person, for the February 7th Bingo session. (and thereafter each week until further notice). The Senior Center will collect a non-refundable \$10 cash deposit (exact change only). This will hold your space and one prepaid game packet. At that time, you will need to show proof of being fully vaccinated.

Since we are limited to 100 attendees, preregistering will guarantee you a seat. However, if we don't sell out, it will be opened up to 1st come, 1st served until we reach 100. On the day of Bingo, you can purchase additional game packets for \$10 each. Until our capacity can be increwased, the Big X payouts will be adjusted accordingly and there will be no Power Balls.

When you get to the main hall for Bingo, we will check you in and you will pick up your pre-paid game pack and whatever additional games you wish to purchase. Seats cannot be saved except for the volunteers who are working that day.

A security guard will be present for crowd control at each session (along with volunteers not playing), to make sure everything runs smsoothly.

Due to new guidelines, we will no longer be able to provide snacks or beverages (including coffee). You may bring in a beverage, but no food will be allowed at this time.

Brown bags for trash will no longer be provided. You can bring your own bag, or use the cans in the room. Volunteers will no longer be able to handle the trash.

We know change is not easy, but in order to bring back Bingo, we need to take baby steps to move forward. Please keep in mind that guidelines are subject to change. Hopefully, some of these changes will be temporary and we can move forward to a new "normal." Thaks for your continued support and understanding. **LET'S PLAY BINGO!**


