

### Celebrating 10 years of Line Dancing

The Brentwood Senior Citizen's Club hosts a line dancing class three times a month. In celebration of their 10 year anniversary, I sat down with **Belle Hodnick** who has been the volunteer instructor for the last decade.

Belle started teaching Line Dancing at the Brentwood Senior Activity Center on March 26th, 2010. She knew the date right off the top of her head and even showed me the original Senior Citizen's Club newsletter the class was advertised in! Starting with less than 10 participants, the line dancing class has ballooned to 30-40 people each class session! Of those 30-40 participants, Belle said that 4 or 5 of them are from the original class in 2010.



Starting line dancing in the late 80s, Belle has been an active dancer for over 30 years. Moving from Arizona to Brentwood in 2008, Belle started looking for a line dancing class. In just a few short months, she found a class at the brand new Senior Center which opened in 2009. The class was eventually cancelled due to lack of participation, but with the encouragement of some of the other participants to become an instructor, Belle offered to start a new line dancing class, free of charge!

In addition to teaching her class 3 times a month, Belle attends other line dancing classes all over the Bay Area, line dancing up to 5 times a week! When she isn't teaching members how to line dance, Belle enjoys hiking, walking and playing bridge monthly. She has also become an avid baker and favors making birthday and wedding cakes.

When asked what her favorite song to line dance to was, Belle said "Right now, *Seniorita* by Sean Mendes and Camilla Cabello." All line dances are choreographed to particular songs so it's hard to choose just one.

I asked Belle what she liked most about volunteering as a line dance instructor. I could tell she really enjoys what she does with her enthusiastic response. "The

satisfaction that people are learning from me. Seeing beginners who stick with it and become really good line dancers! Seeing all the friendships that have formed and the great camaraderie among dancers." Belle's class is bringing people together in our community through line dancing.

If you are new to line dancing, you should know that Belle's class starts off easy each day and increases with difficulty as class progresses; every level of dancer gets their fill. Line Dancing is great exercise for the mind and body. Everyone is welcome!

In my short 15-minute sit down, I can tell you I'm ready to join line dancing! Fun, active and friendly, this group will be a great addition to anyone's monthly calendar. Belle's line dancing class is the 1st, 3rd and 4th Friday of each month in the Main Hall from 12:00pm-2:30pm. This dropin class is FREE to all Senior Citizen's Club members, so don't miss out!


