

Recently the Senior Club's Board has had several good visits with the City of Brentwood, including helpful discussions regarding the idea of increasing program space and time for seniors and Club activities. As you may remember, the City did not include the expansion of the Senior Activity Center building in their two-year capital planning process. Over the past two years, we learned about the hardships created for our members with the Center closed for such an extended time. Knowing that a building expansion/remodel would also mean closing the building for a lengthy period led to reflection about the potential impact of another closure on the Club's activities.

Based on this, the Board decided to undertake an analysis of other options that could support expanded programs for seniors, beginning with current availability of the space. The BSAC is currently open to the public: Mon.–Thurs. 8:30–4:00pm and Friday 8:30–1:00pm.

We see the potential to add more hours and have made this request to the City. The City staff is studying this, and hopefully the next City budget will include funding support for additional staff to allow the Center to be open more hours and thus increase activities and services for all of you.



Out My Kitchen Window *by Richard Griek*

I spend a lot of time in the kitchen, not just looking out the window. I love to cook. Many of my favorite memories revolve around food in some way. Special holidays, camping trips or fishing. These are special not necessarily because of the food but because of the people who share the meals.

My first taste of bouillabaisse was on a camping/fishing trip in 1985 at a place on the Oregon coast called Tahkenitch. Judy and I travelled with some friends up the coast to meet with my dad for a few days of camping and fishing. One evening after some very successful fishing he put together his first bouillabaisse. It was probably the best ending ever to a day of fishing after living in a tent for several days. He cooked a great meal and later made sketches of his tent, fishing gear and a pot of stew on the fire. He wrote out the recipe for me and we have it framed with those sketches in our kitchen. I see it every day and recall the smell of the salt air and the camaraderie around the campfire.

Right around the same time in my life a couple of new friends asked me to join them for an overnight boat trip on San Pablo Bay. The boat was a 26-foot Nordic Tug with a pilot house, salon/galley with a convertible dinette/bunk and a forward cabin. I got the pilot house and slept on the deck. That evening while we were cooking dinner, I heard a story for the first time that became a standard topic of discussion on all our trips that have continued in one way or another for all these years. The characters in this story are the boat owner, Gordy and fellow airport gardeners Randy and Bob. The scene: Gordy is cooking breakfast on the propane stove: bacon, eggs and potatoes. They are having coffee and the salon is filled with breakfast aromas and quiet conversation. Then the propane runs out. Gordy looks for more, but none is found.

The eggs are runny, the bacon pink and limp and the potatoes still raw. Gordy picks up the pans, walks to the side of the boat and dumps the undercooked food into the bay. Randy and Bob look on stunned in disbelief. Bob looks at Gordy and says "you (expletive deleted) belly robber!"

I've had many boat trips with Gordy and Randy, and we still get together a couple of times a year and cook good food, drink beer and tell lies. The boat trips are a thing of the past but when we get together, we always make sure not to be belly robbers.

There are so many memories of gatherings that all of us have and most of them involve sharing food. When we recall them, we know that

the food is only secondary to the people we are with. My mother was at our New Year's Eve in Paris one year and she had such a great time popping the balloons. I can still see the joy in her face. Our club barbeques are another source of special memories with so many volunteers, rocking music and delicious free food for everyone. Cinco de Mayo was a fantastic success that will become an annual tradition for our club. Now that we are returning to some semblance of normal the club has plans for our ice cream social in August, the annual barbeque in September and a New Year's Eve party. We will be making new memories and new friends again.

I can't wait.

Have you ever heard of TRIAD?

Triad is a national community policing initiative where law enforcement professionals, seniors, and community groups within Brentwood partner to meet the crime-safety needs of seniors. The goal of TRIAD is to reduce crimes against the elderly and reduce the unwarranted fear of crime that seniors often experience. Meetings are monthly via ZOOM.

Some of the benefits of TRIAD are:

- Allows seniors to voice concerns about crime and safety
- Provides an avenue for active senior volunteers to help others
- Open communication between public safety personnel, adult services, and seniors
- Strengthens the ties amongst community groups
- Builds a sense of community
