A NOTE FROM BOARD ASSISTANT

Welcome to Spring. For many it seemed like we would never get here, but the unveiling of a new season also brings forth lots of new activities with your Senior Club. The first big new is the result of the 2023 Board elections, with Richard Griek taking on the role of Board President. Richard hit the ground running. His primary interest is to elevate the visibility of the organization within the community and develop new partnerships with other community-based organizations to benefit you, our club members.

Richard is using the information the board has reviewed over the past year regarding our membership as the Board considers how to develop programs to best serve our members. I have spent time trying to answer the question of "who we are" to help us in the process. At the end of 2022 we had 848 paid members, making your Senior Club one of the largest organizations in the community.

Who are these members? We have 234 men and 614 women. Our youngest member was born in 1973 and our oldest in 1929, giving an age range among our members of 50 years. The largest block of members were born in the 1940's (397), with the next largest from the 1950's. Think for a minute about the challenge of developing programs and services for a group with this range of years within the membership.

As you may know, the City of Brentwood is celebrating its 75th Anniversary. The Senior Club went through its membership list and found 40 members who also will have their 75th birthday this year. These members received a commemorative letter from the City. If you will turn 75 this year and would like to receive a letter from City, please let us know at (925) 513-0347.

I enjoy reading anything I can find about senior living. Lately it seems we are the subject of an increasing number of studies as everyone is trying to figure out how to live to 100. 

IN Memoriam • RICHARD "DICK" JAMES RAIMONDI

November 14, 1936 ~ February 17, 2023



Dick was born on 11/14/1936 at Saint Mary's hospital in San Francisco and lived in the City the first five years of his life. He remembered having to turn off lights at night during World War II to hide the coast from the Japanese and selling gum to kids because for some reason his dad was the only one that could get gum at the time.

Shortly after moving to San Jose, Dick was hit by a car and broke his neck. He spent several months in the hospital recovering. In San Jose he attended Willow Glen Elementary, Middle and High Schools, graduating in 1954. During high school he played football and threw shot put. Dick loved football but really excelled as a shot putter. He was the San Jose City champion and held the city record for a number of years.

Dick attended San Jose State for a short period of time. He always told the funny story of being caught by his father playing cards when he was supposed to be in classes. His college experience ended shortly after that.

In 1956 he married Betty Compton. They started a family and had three children; Rick, Cheryl and Brian.

In his professional life, Dick worked with his dad in real estate until his passing in 1957. After that he worked for several years in wholesale drugs with Mekkesen Robins Corporation and several years as a Teamster with Coca Cola Corp's food vending division. During this time he also worked weekends at the San Jose speedway, selling concessions to make extra money for his growing family.

Dick retired in 1993 and he and Betty moved to Rancho Casa Blanca in the desert where Dick began working again as the Security Supervisor. n the early 2000s they returned to San Jose to care for his mother Teresa and his motherin-law Josephine. In 2006 they moved to White Salmon, Washington to a home that they really loved and if you had ever visited you would have known why. Finally, they moved to Brentwood in 2010 and got involved with the Senior Citizens Club almost immediately.

Dick and Betty enjoyed weekly bingo and all the activities that the club had to offer. It wasn't long before he got involved in the leadership of the club as vice president and then president, increasing club membership significantly during that time and really advocating for seniors in the community.

Lastly, Dick really enjoyed traveling. In the last few years, he took cruises to Hawaii, Mexico, the East Coast and Italy/Greece. His family will miss him dearly! Contribution by Brian Raimondi
