BPAL offers a Drop-In Youth Center at Edna Hill Middle School. We are open daily from 3-5pm and on Wednesdays from 1-3pm to students' 6-8 grade. Students are welcome to visit the center anytime during regular hours. We offer homework help, including Chromebooks for online work, board/video games and most importantly a safe place for your child to hang out after school.
