The City of Brentwood is working with Matrix Consulting Group to review operations and services at the Brentwood Senior Activity Center.

The Brentwood City Council has approved an agreement with Matrix Consulting Group to conduct an Operational Assessment and City Wide Recreational Customer Satisfaction Survey. The scope of work will include detailed interviews with Senior Center stakeholders, and will review and assess operations and programming, as well as a city wide survey of past and current recreation participants. The Assessment will include interviews with participants and staff, review of program offerings, contracts for services, special projects, events, and partners. It will review facility usage hours, review any future plans exploring any program changes, assessment of language and cultural access, staff operations and compare with industry best practices. In addition the assessment will conduct a customer satisfaction survey to review program efficiency, facility satisfaction and customer service. The assessment will also compare services to other like/similar cities and their operations. The consultant will then provide a report for the City that will assess the performance of programs and services and that will provide recommendations regarding operations, programming, facilities and service delivery.

If you are interested in providing feedback please look for information that will soon be posted on the City Website and posted at the Brentwood Senior Activity Center. The City highly encourages your participation in the survey.

# Jon's Ramblings

In response to questions from some of you, I thought I would walk through some of the volunteer activities available in our community that club members might find to be interesting.

Although the March election will be well past once you get this newsletter, serving as an election Clerk or Inspector is always an interesting experience and important in helping people participate in our local, state, and national elections. I have served as an election clerk in Contra Costa County for nearly twenty years and enjoy these one-day assignments here in Brentwood. It's always a chance to meet and greet dozens of voters and help them out, pays a small stipend, and there is always a shortage of Clerks and Inspectors.

Another volunteer task that is critical and easy to do for older volunteers is to help pack groceries to be delivered to low-income residents in our area. This takes place twice a month at the Senior Center, every other Thursday from 9:00a.m. to around 10:30. In some cases you can also help with deliveries of the food. Along a similar track is the County's Meals on Wheels program. Drivers sign up to deliver weekly in either the Thursday breakfast program or the Friday hot meals program. I have been doing a Meals on Wheels route for about five years now. It takes maybe an hour and half per week, and the mileage tax deductible.

Our great Brentwood Library also has volunteer opportunities through the Library and through the Friends of the Brentwood Library, a volunteer group dedicated to supporting the Library. I've heard from others that working in the Friends' Second Story Bookshop on the second floor is great fun. Volunteers help visitors to the Bookshop, sort through book donations, help with book sale events, and even serve as puzzle checkers to make sure the jigsaw puzzles aren't missing a piece before they go on sale.

The Library itself also has some great volunteer opportunities that require a commitment of a couple of hours a week. I do what is called "router work "on Mondays and Fridays, where I go through the library pulling books that have been ordered online for patron pickup. The knowledge I have gained about all our library has to offer is really special. The Library also offers a very important program to support adult literacy, called "Project Second Chance". The program trains volunteers and then matches each volunteer with an adult in need of help with literacy skills. These partnerships last forever in many cases.

Of course, the Senior Citizens Club has its own volunteer opportunities, with a core of over 100 members who help out at the many programs and events many of you attend.

Finally, we have been thinking about starting a Breakfast group

for both men and women who would like to get together, meet new people, and enjoy companionship. More information on any of these activities is available by giving me a call at 925-513-0347 or dropping by the front desk at the Senior Center. To all I wish a great volunteer experience, and a happy Spring.



Rosa Chang, Senior Club member, was born in Beijing China and grew up in Taiwan. She came to the United States to study at Santa Clara University. She experienced how Chinese people celebrate Lunar New Year during her childhood. Rosa is proud of her heritage and recently spent some time with our "Oldies but Goodies" senior group sharing the meanings of the Twelve Zodiac Animals.

# 2024 is the year of DRAGON

Rosa shared that there are 12 animals representing the time line which was created by Emperor Jade in order to have a way to calculate time. He had a race for the animals...Rat was the winner and Pig was last. She shared the sequence of the twelve animals and what they represent.

# **Twelve Zodiac Animals**

- 1) Rat wisdom
- 2) Ox diligent
- 3) Tiger bravery
- 4) Rabbit cautious
- 5) Dragon strength
- 6) Snake softness
- 7) Horse courage
- 8) Sheep harmony
- 9) Monkey flexibility
- 10) Rooster stability
- 11) Dog loyalty
- 12) Pig easy going

Rosa explained that every 12 years is a cycle. Therefore if your sign is Dragon, you must be either 12, 24, 36, 48, 60, 72, 84 or 96 years old in 2024.



### **Chinese Characters**

Also, Rosa demonstrated how to write simple Chinese characters based on shape and directions. These characters have no circles and they are always written from top to bottom, and from left to right.



She illustrated the words "people" "big sun" "moon" "bright" "eye" and many others. In just a very short time, our seniors learned how to write quite a few interesting Chinese characters.
