Jon's Ramblings Fall 2024

As the long and hot summer recedes and fall is on the horizon, it is time to start putting together your Senior Club events schedule. I won't seek to restate the many upcoming activities and interesting opportunities, but read this newsletter carefully for all the dates and activities.

In our last newsletter, I wrote a bit about the City of Brentwood's survey of our Club members and other users of programs through the Senior Activity Center.

The results of the survey are back and were reviewed at the first City Council meeting in August. While the report is 60 pages long and includes a number of interesting points, the main part I want to briefly report on is the very strong support shown for the Center's customer service, along with the recognition of the high quality of the many programs being offered and the Senior Center's meeting facilities.

The survey noted that Brentwood, with a 2024 population of 66,854, has close to 100 parks compared to our adjacent communities of Antioch (35) and Pittsburg (26). Brentwood also has a larger staff to support Senior activities than other nearby cities. The report noted the 12,638 registrations for programs from just January to April 2024. A total of 1,510 Senior programs are offered this year, among the largest noted in the East County region.

The report also included some interesting and helpful suggestions that the Senior Center should consider adding programs in the areas of Tai Chi, the arts (painting and writing) cooking, and Yoga. We are always interested in developing new programs and appreciate the suggestions. If you're interested in teaching a class, please give us a call.

It was gratifying to see that the survey's analysis of your responses reinforced the strong support of our Club. As a reminder your Board will hold its annual elections early this winter with four available

positions and we hope people will be interested and willing to join in. If you have questions or thoughts about any of the information above, please let me know (925-513-0347). I hope to hear from you!

Single Mingle Group







The Senior Citizens Club Grant Program will become available April 1st, 2024 for qualifying club members who wish to participate in Senior Citizens Club programs, trips, classes, and special events.

The Senior Citizens Club Grant Program Committee will award \$250.00 grants from April 1st, 2024 through December 31st, 2024 to approved applicants until funds are no longer available. 

BOARD NOMINATIONS OPEN NOVEMBER 4 - NOVEMBER 15, 2024

QUALIFICATIONS:

- **Board positions** no member shall be allowed to hold office unless he/she has been a member in good standing for at least a period of (1) year, and has been approved by the Executive Board.
- All officers shall serve for two (2) years and may serve for a maximum of two terms or four (4) years in each office or until their successors are elected.

POSITIONS OPEN FOR NOMINATION ARE:

Feb. 11, 2025 All elected Board members attend the February board meeting. Oath of office administered by the Board President. Terms of office begin with the February board meeting.


YOUNTER


