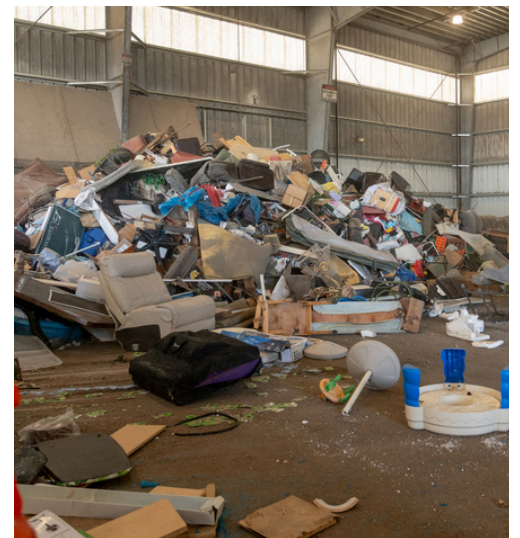
## NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUP WAS A SUCCESSFUL COMMUNITY EFFORT

# DISPOSING HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



Did you miss the recent Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) event? Don't worry! Brentwood residents can still safely dispose of HHW year-round at the Delta Diablo Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, located at 2550 Pittsburg-Antioch Hwy, Pittsburg, CA 94565.

The facility is open on the following days, except holidays:

- Thursday, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.
- Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.
- Saturday, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

## FREE LEAF BAG PROGRAM IS BACK

In an effort to minimize the impact of the fallen leaves in storm drains and to help street sweeping efforts, the City provides FREE leaf bags between October - January to city residents. These clear bags should only be filled with leaves and placed curbside on your regular green waste pickup day. Only bags provided by the City will be serviced for this program. ## LONE TREE WAY ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS

### ENGINEERING

The Engineering Department is pleased to announce the completion of Phase 1 of the Lone Tree Way Roadway Improvements. This phase included a number of upgrades designed to improve both safety and accessibility. The following work was completed in Phase 1:

- Improved pedestrian access, including:
  - ADA-compliant ramps
  - Temporary asphalt sidewalks
  - New concrete sidewalks
  - Enhanced crosswalks
- Widening of Smith Road to allow two lanes in each direction
- Rehabilitation of the existing roadway, featuring hot mix asphalt mill and fill, along with slurry seal applications
- Upgraded storm drain infrastructure, with bio-retention for water treatment and additional drain inlets to mitigate flooding



Phase 2 of the project will continue in the coming months and will include:

- Undergrounding of utilities and the removal of PG&E poles
- Installation of permanent concrete sidewalks along Lone Tree Way and Smith Road
- Widening of Lone Tree Way near Smith Road, with right-of-way negotiations ongoing with homeowners
- Continued improvements to the storm drain system along Lone Tree Way
- Installation of a traffic signal at Lone Tree Way and Smith Road for improved safety and traffic flow

The Engineering Department appreciates your patience as we continue this critical project to enhance Lone Tree Way. Stay tuned for updates as Phase 2 progresses!



## AERIAL SAFETY INSPECTIONS BY PG&E

The City of Brentwood received notice from Pacific Gas & Electric regarding upcoming aerial safety inspections.

### Message from PG&E:

Every day, we are making the electric system safer and stronger for our customers. As part of this work, we perform regular inspections of our electrical equipment to help reduce risks and keep our communities safe. We will be in your area using a helicopter to inspect our electric towers and equipment. These safety inspections will take place within the next two weeks.

### What to expect:

- During inspections, you may see and hear a helicopter flying close to the equipment.

- The helicopter may hover in the same location to perform these inspections, and if it does, it will usually be for less than 30 minutes.
- Pilots will follow all safety standards and federal regulations.
- You may also see and hear PG&E and/or contractor trucks in the area.

## EXCITING CHANGES TO HOMECOMING PARK

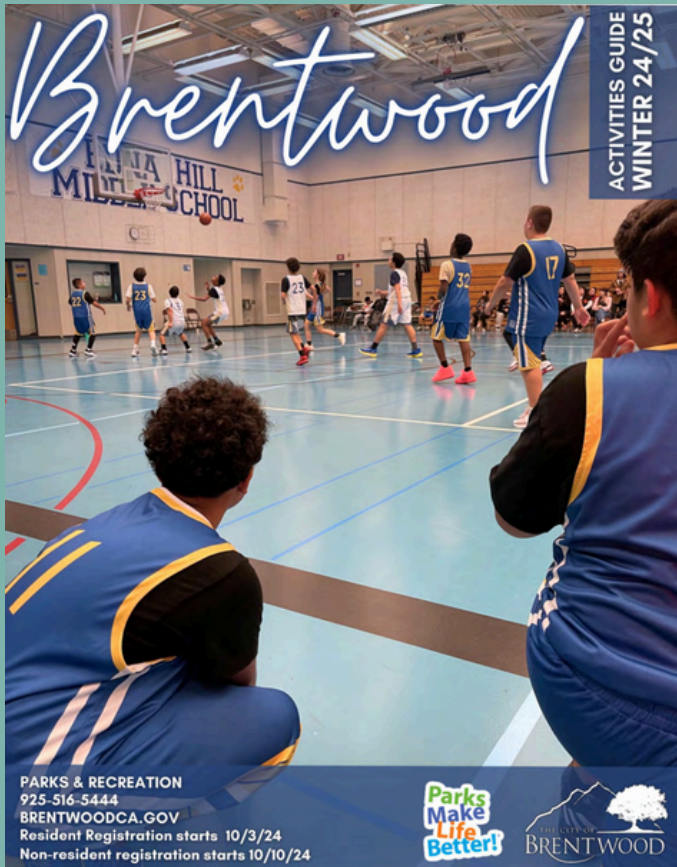

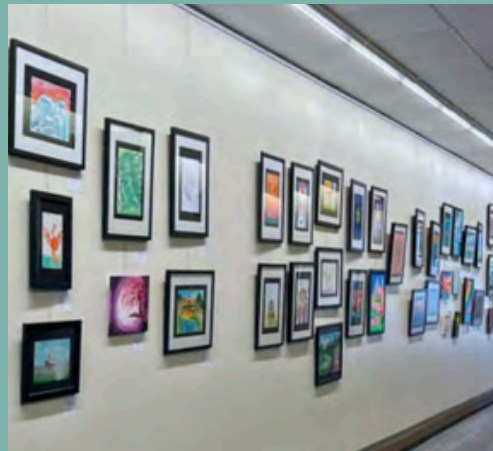

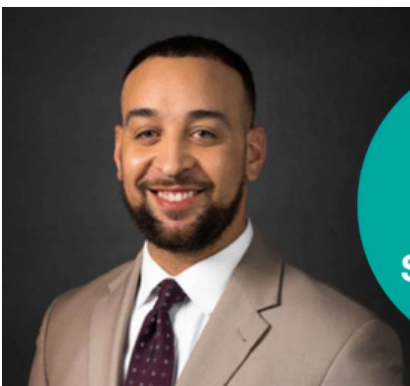
## A NEW ADDITION TO DOWNTOWN BRENTWOOD

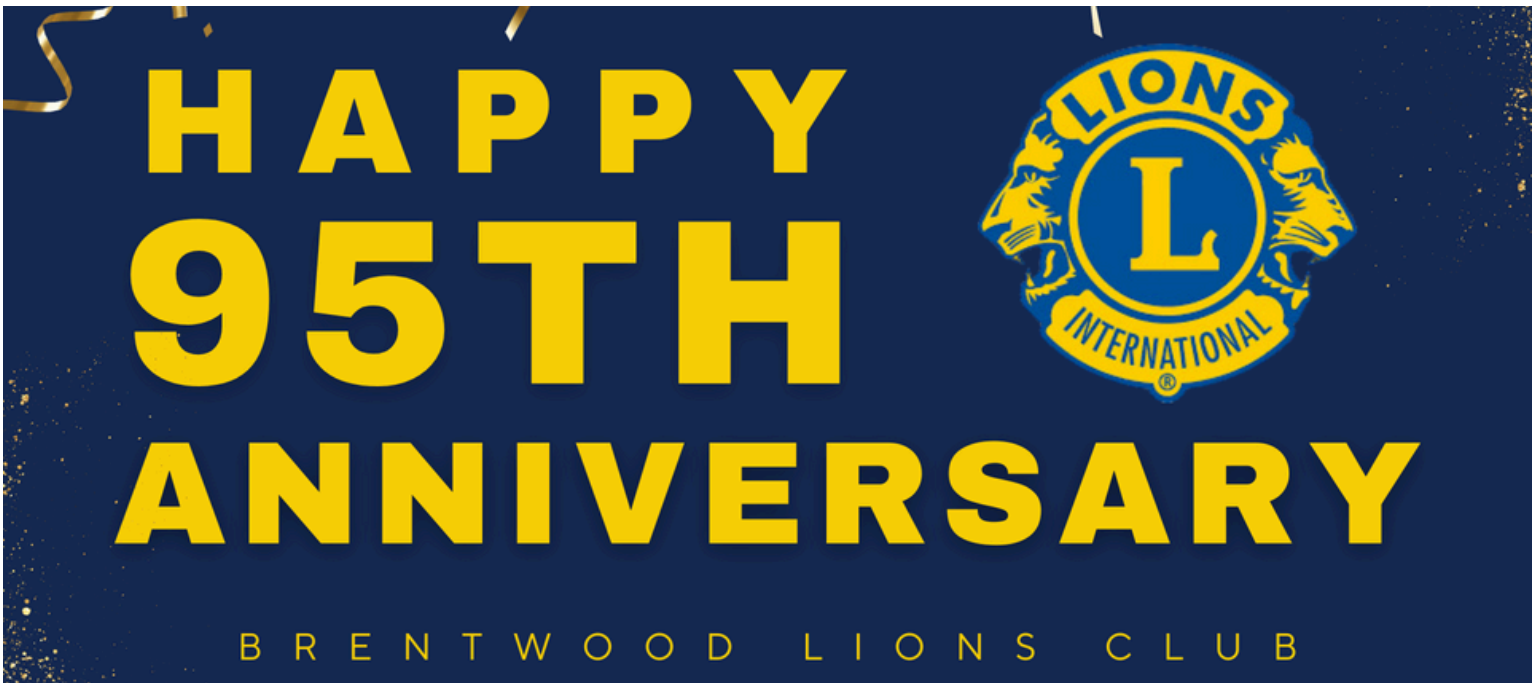

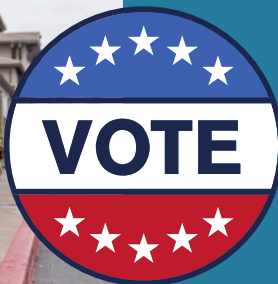
